



Dear KIPP Colorado Families,

We hope you are all doing well in these uncertain times. Please know we are here to support you in any way we can! We will be launching remote learning with your student on Thursday, April 9th, 2020. As you may have seen, yesterday, Mayor Hancock issued a “Stay at Home” order to all those in Denver; however, his team worked with Denver Public Schools (DPS) and the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) to exempt both DPS food distribution sites and technology distribution to families in preparation for remote learning. While we are committed to getting our students learning again, we are prioritizing the health of our KIPPsters, their families, and our staff and following strict CDPHE health and safety guidelines for distribution.

You may have received communication directly from DPS on technology distribution late last week. However, KIPP Colorado Schools will be setting its own schedule for distribution, and for families who do not have devices at home, we will be distributing Chromebooks for 2nd-12th grader and mini ipads for ECE-1st graders on Thursday, March 26th and Friday, March 27th. Please keep reading for important information on ongoing family communications, and schedule details and directions on how to pick-up a device if you need one.

How will we regularly communicate with you?

We recognize that communication is really important now more than ever. During this time, we will be sending all of our communications out via the Flyer app.



Please download the application by going to the app store on your phone and searching “Flyer”. The icon has a blue and white background with a yellow paper airplane. Download the app. Click ‘Add’, search for your school’s name, tap on the name (a checkmark will appear next to our school name) and then click ‘Add’ again. You can add more than one school if you have children at multiple KIPP schools.

If you are picking up for students with two different last names at KNE, KNDMS, KSPA and KDC please choose one time. Please note the only 9th graders at KIPP Denver Collegiate need to collect a Chromebook. All other high school students should have taken their Chromebook home already. Please reach out to your school if your high schooler does not have a Chromebook and needs one. We are working on a plan to replace Chromebooks that are broken while at home and will communicate that soon.

What will distribution look like at each school?

If you are driving: For the safety of your family and our staff please do not get out of the car. We are minimally staffed and you may have to wait a couple minutes. A gloved staff member will hand you a bundle with information and technology devices. They can also answer any questions you have or take down your information and get back to you if they don't know the answer.

If you are walking: We will have a table set-up labeled with "PICK UP DEVICES HERE". Please wait at that table until someone comes to assist you. If another family is already at the table please form a line with space between each family (per the markings on the ground).



All staff members who are helping distribute technology will be wearing gloves and following sanitation protocols required by CDPHE. Staff members who are sick or living with an immunocompromised person are not helping with tech distribution.

Again, the health of our KIPPsters, their families, and our staff is our top priority right now. We are excited to get our KIPPsters learning again, and we appreciate your support in making that happen. Please stay safe and healthy, and reach out with any concerns!
